"Missioning Service"

In 1946 Mother Edna began the Missioning slip. Each Community Director after her attached their own artistic flare to the missioning card. In Mother Edna's words: "As you kneel before the tabernacle for three minutes of silent adoration, with that sealed assignment in your hands, ask our dear Lord to give you the spirit of sacrifice and the supernatural charity to enhance His glory by a wholehearted surrender to His will. You may meet with trials and sorrows in carrying out His designs for you, but there is always joy and peace in the heart of one who generously serves God. May he give each of us the grace to do that for another year! Signed, Lovingly in St. Francis, Mother M. Edna.

The missioning slip of paper was simple. At the top was a TAU cross surrounded by J. M. J. F. = Jesus, Mary, Joseph, Francis. And then:

In the spirit of Holy obedience you,

are assigned to for the ensuing year.

May the Lord bless thee and keep thee; may he show His face to thee and have mercy upon thee; May he turn His countenance to thee and give thee peace. May the Lord bless thee. Amen.

Any memories to share of receiving appointments...out in the court, in chapel, on mission?


In 1975 a more formal service for distributing appointments was held. Then on May 1, 1978 a light blue holy card was distributed with the appointments and it read:

Now meet the Franciscans, Order of Friars Minor-OFM who served the Motherhouse from 1995

Beginning in 1970 two chaplains began attending the Sisters: one for the Motherhouse and one for St. Rita's. The chaplains for St. Rita's

will be our last group to focus on. Now, following the death of Rev. Julian Resch, Norbertine, in 1993, the Franciscans began to minister as chaplains to the Motherhouse.

February 1, 1994—April 4, 1995: Rev.

Donald Brody was a member of the Order of Friars Minor Capuchin. Franciscans reformed as Capuchins in 1525 with the purpose of regaining the original habit of St. Francis and

also for returning to a stricter observance of the rule of St. Francis.OFM Capuchin. Was the Motherhouse Chaplain from February 1, 1994—January 1995.

<u>Summer 1995-January 1998:</u> Rev. Louis Franzcek was our first of the Order of Friars Minor, OFM.

Rev. De Paul Sobotka served 1998 until July 2008

Rev. Robert Konopa served Sept. 2008—Dec. 2008

Rev. Tony Curignani served Dec. 2008—Jan. 2009

Rev. Finian Zaucha served from Oct-Dec. 2000; Dec. 2009-August 2011; and August 2013—2017

Rev. Nathan Jaskulski served Aug. 2011-Aug. 2012

Rev. Placid Stroik has served since August 2012

Rev. Hilary Brezczinski served May 2013-Sept. 2020

Rev. Gerald Prusakowski has served since Dec. 2017.
